


OPERATING SURPLUS (DEFICIT)



Peace Corps Budget

GOAL FOR FY 2022

\$450 million to support Volunteer redeployment in a changed world.

GOAL FOR FY 2025 \$600 million to support 10,000 Volunteers.

House of Representatives

\$430 Million Budget for FY 2022

Ideas and Expectations from the Peace Corps Community

- Address systemic racism in the Volunteer experience — recruitment, service in the field, and back home.
- Foster two-way exchange with host countries.
- Create customized assignments to match needs with Volunteer skills.
- Focus on climate change as a cross-sector initiative.
- Revamp medical services to lengthen health coverage post-service.

- Peace Corps must enable NPCA and affiliate groups to connect with Volunteers to enhance Third Goal impact.
- Be intentional in creating systems to address mental health, racial injustices, and socioeconomic challenges for BIPOC Volunteers during and after service.
- Expand federal noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) to three years for RPCVs.

Peace Corps Reauthorization Act of 2021

Increases funding to \$600 million by fiscal year 2025

Establishes a Peace Corps National Advisory Council

Extends health care provision for RPCVs (up to six months, three paid by agency)

Allows use of Peace Corps seal,emblem, or name of grave markers/death notices Extends whistleblower protection to PCVs

A BILL

To amend the Peace Corps Act to reauthorize the Peace Corps, better support current and returned volunteers, and for other purposes.

Improves non-competitive eligibility for federal hiring

Increases workers compensation for RPCVs (from GS-7 to GS-11)

Raises the floor for readjustment allowance to \$417/month


