## **5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Illinois**

| 1 | In 2023, Illinois was tied for 14th in the nation in sending Peace Corps Volunteers overseas. In 2020 the greater Chicago region ranked 3rd among major metropolitan areas in sending volunteers.   |

| 2 | Among medium colleges and universities, Loyola University of Chicago tied for 11th in 2019/2020 in sending Peace Corps Volunteers overseas. Northwestern University and Southern Illinois University ranked 16th and 19th in sending volunteers overseas.   |
| 3 | Peace Corps has educational partnerships with Twelve Institutions, across the state, including Aurora University, DePaul University, Illinois State University, Illinois Wesleyan University, Northeastern Illinois University, Monmouth College, Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, and Western Illinois University. |
| 4 | National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups include the Chicago Area Peace<br>Corps Association (CAPCA), which held its annual fundraising dinner in December,<br>2023. Proceeds will support small grants to serving volunteers, CAPCA's<br>scholarship program, and other local non-profit organizations.             |
| 5 | Returned Peace Corps Volunteer and Springfield native Carlos Ortega was recently appointed as the new executive director of Downtown Springfield Incorporated, the city's downtown business association.  |
