5 Things to Know about the Peace Corps Community in Maine

In 2019, Maine ranked 8th in the nation in sending volunteers overseas on a per capita basis.

Among small colleges and universities, Colby College tied for 16th in 2019/2020 in sending Peace Corps Volunteers overseas. The Peace Corps has an educational partnership through its Coverdell Fellows program with the University of Maine School of Social Work.

National Peace Corps Association affiliate groups include the Maine Peace Corps Association. The group has an active membership of 400, an e-newsletter and social media presence on Facebook. Recent group activities include holding a virtual fundraiser and discussion on local refugee support.

In 2021, Shenna Bellows was sworn in as Maine's 50th Secretary of State, and the state's first female secretary. Raised in Hancock, Bellows was a Peace Corps Volunteer in Panama, and also an Americorps/VISTA Volunteer in Tennessee.

The 54 acre Goose River Peace Corps Preserve (near Waldoboro) was donated in 2001 to the Medomak Valley Land Trust by a group of friends who met each other while serving with the Peace Corps in Turkey.
